	<p><a href="#">The African Refugee Development Center</a>, founded in 2004 by asylum seekers and Israeli citizens, is a non-profit organization created to assist, support and empower African refugees and African asylum seekers in Israel. The ARDC advocates for the rights of refugees and asylum seekers and for a humane and fair Israeli asylum policy. The ARDC divides its work between individual counseling, humanitarian aid, education, community development, and awareness raising and policy initiatives.</p>	<p><b>Position Title:</b> Welcome Center Site Manager  <b>Internship Description:</b> The welcome center site manager will inform, assist and refer refugees in issues related to asylum procedure, health, housing employment, education, and social and psychological care. Some of their duties include providing practical and emotional assistance to families living in ARDC's shelters, serving as either English or Hebrew tutors, welcoming and registering new refugee students, coordinating the class schedule, and helping manage the center.  <b>Requirements:</b> Background in counseling, education, nonprofit management or other field is preferred. Other languages, such as Hebrew, French, Arabic, are a bonus.</p>
	<p><a href="#">Save a Child's Heart (SACH)</a> is an international non-profit organization which provides life-saving cardiac care to children from developing countries, and offers comprehensive training to medical professionals from these countries.</p>	<p><b>Position Title:</b> Public Relations Intern  <b>Internship Description:</b> The public relations intern will gain experience in a variety of capacities, including public relations, marketing, fundraising, and working with group visits and special events. They will also get to spend time with some amazing children who are patients at SACH.  <b>Requirements:</b> Outgoing, go-getter, positive personality is a must.</p>
	<p>For 15 years, <a href="#">IsraAID</a> has been helping people all over the world overcome extreme crises and has provided millions with the vital support needed to move from destruction to reconstruction, and eventually, to sustainable living. Our teams of professional medics, search &amp; rescue squads, post-trauma experts and community mobilizers, have been first on the front lines of nearly every major humanitarian response in the 21st century.</p>	<p><b>Position Title:</b> HR Assistant  <b>Internship Description:</b> The HR assistant will control the HR database. They will input data into the database and then help to find good candidates to send on missions. In this capacity, they will call candidates to ask if they are interested in volunteering. They will also help to compile, write and design Water, Sanitation and Health manuals. They will also occasionally assist with graphic design needs.  <b>Requirements:</b> Organizational skills, attention to detail, and good writing skills. Computer and technical knowledge is a plus.</p>
	<p><a href="#">ASSAF</a> was founded in 2007 in order to aid refugees and asylum seekers in Israel. In Hebrew, the acronym for ASSAF stands for the Aid Organization for Refugees. Our aim is to promote the rights of refugees in their encounters with the state authorities. This includes providing advocacy and support to those in need: thousands of men, women and children who are conducting a daily struggle to overcome memories of the traumatic experiences they have escaped, and who are living in Israel without status or access to basic human rights.</p>	<p><b>Position Title:</b> Barak Project Intern  <b>Internship Description:</b> Intern will research HIV treatment for asylum seekers in other countries to see the best practices, and where Israel can do better, meet with HIV+ asylum seekers to evaluate how they feel as well as the stigma within the community, and run a support group, ask experts to talk about HIV in Israel, the resources they have, prevention techniques, etc.  <b>Requirements:</b> Human rights background is appreciated, with knowledge of refugee rights, as well as understanding the social implications of living with HIV.</p>
