#### **ORGANIZATION BACKGROUND**

Young Judaea is a diverse community that educates and empowers Jewish youth to deeply engage with Israel and to lead positive change for the Jewish People, Israel and the World. For over 115 years, Young Judaea has inspired Jewish youth of diverse backgrounds to become engaged leaders and inspired activists with a deep personal connection to Israel. Young Judaea does this through a robust arc of programs that include junior/regional camps, a national teen camp, year-round regional and national programming, Israel immersive travel experiences, and alumni gatherings. Young Judaea Teens is the movement's teen division, providing Jewish teens with opportunities to build community, develop leadership skills, explore their identities, and create meaningful impact through peer-led programming and engagement.

#### **SUMMARY OF JOB RESPONSIBILITIES**

The Regional Advisor serves as the primary advisor and mentor for a Young Judaea Teens region, supporting regional teen leaders in creating impactful programming, strengthening community, and developing leadership skills. This position works closely with the regional Mazkirut (teen leadership board) and plays a key role in connecting local clubs, regional leadership, and the broader Young Judaea movement.

The Regional Advisor is responsible for overseeing the quality of regional programming, mentoring teen leaders, supporting local club development, and helping cultivate the next generation of Jewish and Zionist leaders.

#### **CORE JOB RESPONSIBILITIES**

- Serve as the primary advisor to the regional Mazkirut (teen leadership board)
- Partner with the Mazkirut to plan and execute the regional convention and other regional programs and events
- Supervise and support Local Teen Coordinators within the region, where applicable
- Collaborate with teen leaders on outreach efforts and identifying potential future leaders
- Ensure the quality, effectiveness, and consistency of regional programming
- Mentor and develop leadership skills among teen leaders
- Strengthen connections between local clubs, the region, and the broader Young Judaea movement
- Support regional growth, engagement, and leadership development initiatives

#### **ADDITIONAL JOB RESPONSIBILITIES**

- Attend weekly meetings with the Regional Mazkirut



- Hold monthly one-on-one meetings with Regional Mazkirut members
- Participate in monthly advisor staff meetings
- Attend monthly supervision meetings
- Attend regional programs and events throughout the year
- Participate in advisor trainings and MLT Weekend
- Organize and oversee the annual regional convention

### **JOB COMPETENCIES**

- College graduate required
- Young Judaea alumni preferred
- Prior supervision or staff management experience preferred
- Experience working with teens is required
- Experience in educational, youth development, or experiential learning settings preferred
- Must reside within the region during the academic year
- Strong interpersonal, communication, and relationship-building skills
- Highly organized, dependable, and able to work independently
- Self-motivated with strong time-management skills
- Commitment to Young Judaea's mission and values

### **POSITION DETAILS**

- Part-time position
- Approximately 20–25 hours per week
- Employment term: August 15 – June 15
- Flexible work arrangement: meetings are primarily conducted virtually, while regional events, conventions, and select programs are held in person
- Work is primarily conducted during afternoons, evenings, and weekends to align with teen schedules.
- Attendance required at three annual in-person weekends:
  - MLT Weekend (late August–early September)
  - National Convention (MLK Weekend)
  - Regional convention (February-March)
- Opportunities for summer employment at Young Judaea camps may be available

### **COMPENSATION**

- Up to \$15,000 annually, commensurate with experience and responsibilities.
- Travel and accommodations are provided for attending conventions.
